Deadline Set: December 31st, 2018

If you have considered Solar in the past, or are open to looking at it now, this would be a great time to visit or revisit. Your business's Energy Costs and Demand Charges can be reduced and controlled. The ZREC slots are available for roof areas of 10,000 SF and above.

- 1. Investment returns are historically high for projects today (12-15% return before financing).
- 2. Key incentives are set to expire or phase down in 2019 (Net Metering, 30% tax credit, ZREC bonus payments).
- 3. Last chance to be "grand-fathered" into Net Metering, a VERY Lucrative Utility Program.

RECENT SUCCESS STORIES

Branford Veterinary Hospital – Since 1937, Branford Veterinary Hospital (BVH)

has been committed to providing the highest quality veterinary care. They have also been in the same building since the inception of the business in 1937. After considerable business growth over the last decade, BVH selected a new location that would allow for considerably more space. Munger was hired to construct the approximately 5,818 SF two story, wood framed building, conveniently located down the street, at 125 North Branford Road in Branford. The new facility features four exam rooms, cat and dog waiting areas, a radiology room, glass enclosed medical wards, an indoor exercise area and three doctor's offices in order to allow BVH to perform their wide array of veterinary services.

Michael Cormier headed up the project as Project Manager and James DeMaio executed Project Supervisor duties. This project incorporated a unique, "Colonial Salt Box", farmhouse design. As BVH owner Scott Gavaletz, D.V.M. explained, "The old farm property has been a landmark in town for over one hundred years. We wanted

to continue the legacy, so we modeled the hospital after the original farmhouse." The facility incorporates farmhouse themes, ranging from wood beamed ceilings to a farm-style design waiting room. The Munger team found it particularly exciting to merge all the amenities of a stateof-the-art vet hospital into a rustically aesthetic Colonial Salt Box farmhouse.

Lee Residence – Robert and Linda Lee came to Munger Construction with the desire to construct a residential home in Clinton, CT. Michael Cormier, Project Manager, and Alan Kostek, Project Supervisor coordinated all phases of construction from concept to completion. The design of the home was developed by Noyes Vogt Architects and GNCB Consulting Engineers.



This project, which started in August of 2017, features a three-floor home, with an elevator system and a rooftop patio that looks out over Long Island Sound. The residence is a combination of wood-framing, structural steel, and structural wood support columns/beams. The exterior boasts a rubber membrane roof with drainage systems on all levels, standing seam metal roofing, and Hardi Plank Siding to withstand coastal winds and salt erosion. Interior features include

high-end cabinetry, wood trims, hickory floors, high-impact windows/doors, and three full kitchens with top-of-the-line appliances. A geothermal well system was installed 350 feet below the property, which functions to heat and cool the home by transferring heat to and from the ground.

The Munger team is often met with jobsite challenges and the Lee Residence proved to be no exception. When framing the home special attention was required to incorporate the unique combination of wood beams and structural steel. Executing the project during winter sub-zero temperatures and coastal wind made for exceptionally cold working conditions. The Munger team met these challenges head on and the end result is a spectacular waterfront home. We are grateful for this opportunity and wish Linda and Robert good health and happiness in their new home.

WORK-IN-PROGRESS

Premier Subaru – Construction for the brand new Premier Subaru facility, located at **155 North Main Street in Branford**, is well underway. The 33,0000 SF, state-ofthe-art dealership will showcase the very latest in what Premier Subaru has to offer in regards to functionality and design.

Michael Cormier and **Jeff Landon** are acting as Project Manager and Project Supervisor, respectively. Demolition of the pre-existing structures on the property, all necessary site work, and the footings and foundation work is complete. Structural steel for the Varco Pruden building was delivered and the steel erection will begin by mid-September.

The dealership, scheduled for completion in summer of 2019, will feature all Subaru design/layout branding requirements. Highlights of the facility include an 8-car showroom with a coffee bar, fireplace and antique Subaru car display. The 30-bay service area includes 18 Drive-Thru Service lanes, 3 Express Service lifts and 2 computer alignment stations. Customers will enjoy a 50-seat waiting area that will allow them to view the work performed on their vehicles through a glass partition.

This marks the second major construction project Munger has been selected for by Premier Auto Group and President, Bob Alvine. "Munger's long-term relationship with Mr. Alvine is what means the most to us", said David DeMaio, Munger president. "We are honored to once again have the opportunity to showcase Munger Services and Core Values through this prestigious and noteworthy project."

Goldfish Swim School – Goldfish Swim School, located at **112 Main Street in Norwalk**, will provide a top of the line swimming facility, dedicated to indoor swim classes for children. Munger was contracted to complete the interior fit-out of an existing 9,000 SF building. The project involves the excavation for, and installation of a 30 x 70-foot heated pool, installation of an observation area for parents, and construction of a "Caribbean Themed" changing area.

Project Manger, **Joe Pierandi**, and Project Supervisor, **Geoffrey Benbow**, oversee this project. The Munger team is currently installing tile, painting, and constructing "changing huts" on the dry side of the pool facility. The excavation for the pool is complete and the foundation and pool construction is in progress.

Goldfish Swim School marks the first indoor swimming pool construction project for Munger. We are excited to be working on this facility and to have the opportunity to add pool installation to our repertoire!

TECH TIP

Hurricane Preparedness Will Safeguard Your Commercial Property

Hurricane season is here to stay until November 30th. While most commercial and industrial facilities are built to withstand the threats of major storms, building owners can take a number of steps to prevent damage to their properties. Your commercial builder can also assist you with challenging tasks to minimize costly damage.

Across are some tips for protecting your building.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

- Clean drains, gutters and downspouts to facilitate water flow.
- Prevent broken glass and façade damage by trimming tree limbs and removing loose objects that could become projectiles in a high wind.
- Routinely test backup generators and have sufficient fuel for extended power outages.
- Check for leaking roof sealants and roof penetrations such as stacks, skylights, chimneys, and make repairs as needed.
- Reinforce glass doors and storefronts.
- Install additional door hinges and deadbolt locks to prevent doors from flying open during hurricane winds.
